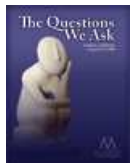

While the leadership principle of aligning words to actions, or “walking your talk” has been around for a long time, the behavioral integrity construct that supports systematic empirical research into the principle is relatively new. This symposium presents six papers that use the Behavioral Integrity construct to frame new questions and develop new insights into leadership. It spans a range of questions, from “How is it measured?” to “How is it perceived and by whom?” to “How do the consequences work?” to “How can it be managed?” The answers and insights we find are suggestive, but far from exhaustive. This symposium will be a forum for showing the potential of the construct, raising questions about it and building the community of behavioral integrity scholars.
